Case II Alternate Medicine Pitfalls

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43 yrs old male College Professor known as diabetic, hypertensive x 6-7 yrs came to the hospital with complaints of extreme weakness, stiffness in limbs, difficulty walking, burning feet, unsteadiness, and urinary retention – catheterised in another hospital.

Had taken Sidda medicines for 7 months for haemorrhoids. Clinically tachycardia, BP - 100/70mmHg. CNS – Slurred speech – appeared depressed. HMF normal. Resting tremors+, Cog wheeling++, stiffness+ Power 4+/5. DTJ++ sensory blunting distally. Clinically – Mild Parkinsons' disease. Depression. ? Toxic neuropathy. (Heavy metal poisoning) Routine investigations normal.

CT Brain normal. Treated with antihypertensives, OHA, antiparkinsons medication, anxiolytics, antidepressants, and pregabalin. Slowly improved over 2 weeks. Mobilised. Toxic profile (heavy metals) done in Thyrocare revealed markedly elevated Arsenic mercury. Progressively improved. During follow-up after 1 month. No neurological deficit – mild stiffness gait. Ambulant no urinary complaints. Final Diagnosis: Toxic Neuropathy. (Heavy Metal Poisoning Sidda Medication)
